Illinois' private colleges are serving students and building communities.



Illinois' non-profit private colleges and universities represent a valuable asset to the citizens of our state. They operate over 130 campuses, employ nearly 65,000 faculty and staff, and annually contribute over \$9 billion in economic activity at the state and local level. Almost half of all Illinois upper division students are enrolled at these institutions.

Independent colleges and universities provide smaller classes, individualized learning environments, unique programs, and the personal attention that students need to succeed. These assets enable independent college students to graduate sooner, and complete their programs, at the highest levels in the state.

The contribution of these institutions is significant, and will increasingly become essential to absorb a looming college student population boom. Over the next few years Illinois will see the largest wave of high school graduates since the Baby Boom.

Receiving less than 8 percent of all state funding for higher education, the independent colleges and universities produce an excellent intellectual and economic return on the state's investment. Illinois private colleges and universities are serving students and building communities.

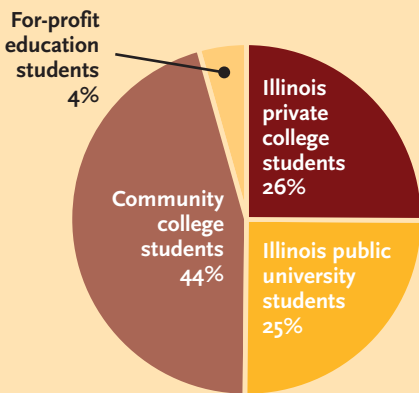

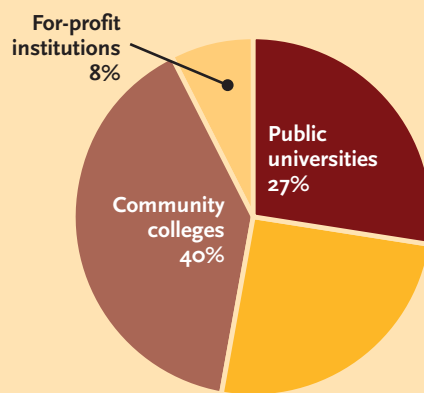

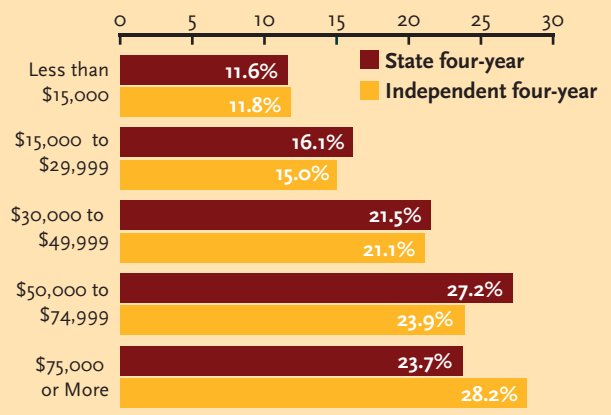
Illinois college enrollments by sector, 2005-06

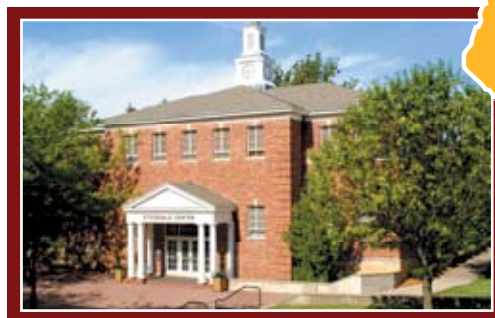
